Schools Out!



Those of you who have lived in Childs Ercall for some time, will no doubt be familiar with the old village school (pictured above). Some of you may even have been past pupils. The school closed its doors for the last time in August 2008, with just 16 pupils on the register, when the efforts of the Diocese of Lichfield to try and keep the Church of England primary school open failed. It was a sad day when the school finally closed, but Shropshire County Council said it was economically unsustainable and the small number of pupils made it impossible to run efficiently.

Since its closure, the playground of the school has been sold off for redevelopment, whilst what remains of the building itself, although tenanted for a period, has been uninhabited for some time and gradually fallen into disrepair. You can see from the photos above that the grounds are overgrown, and the old school room (top left) has some interesting flooring. However, there is good news! Passers-by may have noticed the recent appearance of a 'For Sale' board on the entrance to the building, signifying that it is now finally on the market. At the time of going to print, there had been a great deal of interest in the property, for which sealed bids were invited, and it is now understood to have been sold subject to contract. The new owners will certainly have a lot of work to do, and it will be interesting to see what the plans are to restore or redevelop the site.
